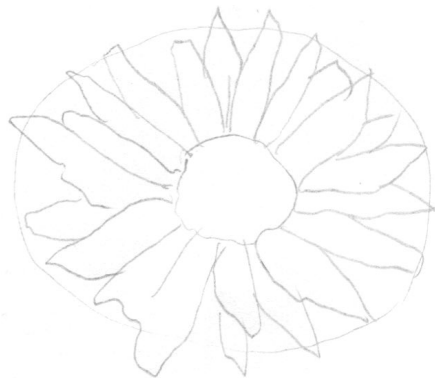
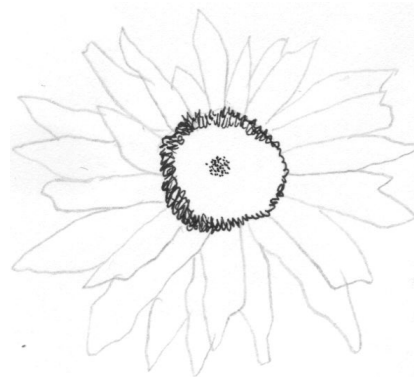


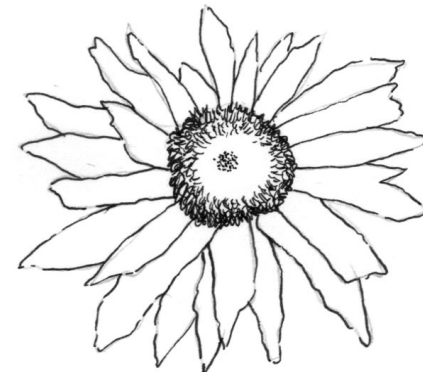
“Daisies”, Step-by-step instructions. Marker size 005.



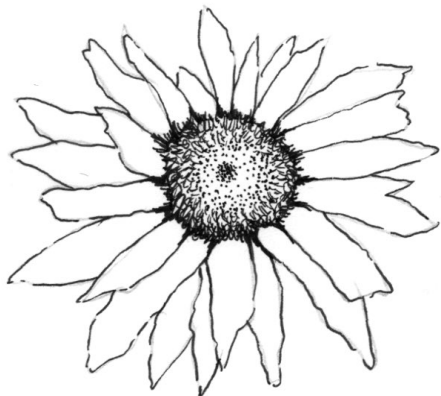
Draw the center oval of the daisy and surround it with a larger oval to determine the length of the petals. Outline the petals. Vary sizes and overlaps.



Scribble around the center oval. Stipple in the middle.



Outline the petals with slightly intermittent lines. Criss cross from the scribble lines halfway towards the center.



Stipple to transition from the crisscross lines towards the center of the flower. Scribble where the petals overlap and attach to the seed stems to deepen the shadows.



Use wavy lines to follow the contour of the petals. Draw more lines on the petals that lie underneath.



To let the flower stand out from the paper, add another one underneath, add some stems and leaves and just scribble away, starting around the petals, filling the spaces between stems or leaves. Stipple or parallel hatch foliage in the background or underneath.
